


Max Tillman Barron

Max was born in Round Rock, Texas on July 9, 1931, and passed away on January 13, 2010.






























John 11:32-45



They said to him: "Lord, come and see." 35 Jesus gave way to tears. 36 Therefore the Jews began to say: "See, what affection he used to have for him!" 37 But some of them said: "Was not this [man] that opened the eyes of the blind man able to prevent this one from dying?"

38 Hence Jesus, after groaning again within himself, came to the memorial tomb. It was, in fact, a cave, and a stone was lying against it. 39 Jesus said: "TAKE the stone away." Martha, the sister of the deceased, said to him: "Lord, by now he must smell, for it is four days." 40 Jesus said to her: "Did I not tell you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?" 41 Therefore they took the stone away. 

The Norfolk Receiving Station, commanded by Captain John Harlee, USN, processes approximately 8,000 men a month on the way to and from Naval Activities all over the world.


